



AIMS

We aim to provide an environment in which children will be encouraged to learn through play, promoting all aspects of their development.

We aim to do this by:

- » providing a home from home experience where we can follow the babies' routines and parents' own values to ensure the continuity of care.
- » working towards the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum.
- » promoting equality of opportunity for all children and families, ensuring each child is equally valued in a secure and happy atmosphere.
- » providing a safe, stimulating environment in which children feel confident to make choices and motivated to become independent learners.

- » giving both parent and child support of a keyperson.
- » providing opportunities for you and your family to be involved in the themed activities and in your own child's progress.
- » providing continuity of care and education for children who attend more than one provider. Ensuring communication with the other provider, with parental consent.

The Centre is owned and managed by Activate Learning and based at Banbury and Bicester College. Hobby Horse Children's Centre offers a safe and stimulating environment for your child.

We provide childcare for children between the ages of three months and 10 years. We operate a Playscheme for school aged children during the school holidays.

At Hobby Horse Children's Centre we offer 2-year-old funding as well as 3-year-old funding both 15 and 30 hours.

OFSTED

Ofsted rated the children's centre as Good in every area, in its most recent inspection (November 2021).

ADMISSIONS

Places at the Children's Centre are offered to students, staff of the college and the wider community.

The Centre Manager is responsible for allocating places. We encourage you and your child to visit as often as you'd like whilst making your decision to attend. When your child has been offered a place at the centre, we will arrange settling-in sessions for you and your child.



CENTRE HOURS

- Monday-Friday, 8.30am-5.30pm

Helen Collins - Centre Manager

Helen has overall responsibility for the Children's Centre. She holds an NVQ level 3 and 4 in Childcare and Education and has worked at the Centre since September 1992. She has experience of working with children in schools and nurseries, and a vast amount of experience of working with children with special needs and challenging behaviour. Helen is responsible for the welfare of the children, staff and students and is the overall Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) for the Centre.

Katie has worked at the Centre since July 1996 and holds an NNEB Diploma Qualification and NVQ Level 4 in Childcare. She has a considerable amount of experience of working with children from 0-4 years and supports the 0-3 Unit Coordinator as well as the whole Centre. Katie is also the Child Protection Coordinator and the SENCO support for the Centre.



Kelly has been at the Centre since July 2000. She holds a Diploma in Nursery Nursing qualification and a NVQ Level 4 in childcare. She is the Coordinator for the 3-5 Unit and has considerable experience of working with this age group. Kelly is also the joint Behaviour Coordinator and SENCO support for the Centre.



Sarah Willis - Senior Nursery Nurse

Sarah has worked at the Centre since July 2001 after completing a Diploma in Childcare and Education. She has experience of working with children aged 1-3 years and is the Coordinator for the 0-3 Unit and joint Behaviour Coordinator for the Centre.

A HOME FROM HOME

The Honey Bee Room

Our baby room: from 3 months up to approximately 15 months

The room is made to feel like home, with an eating, sleeping and play area. We work in partnership with parents to ensure that a child's individual needs are met in a fun, safe and secure environment. In the babies' play area, we operate an indoor shoe policy.





The Busy Bee Room

Our toddler room: from 15 months up to approximately 2 years

This is a spacious room, offering a range of toys and activities that encourage children to develop their interests, learn new skills and play happily together.



The Caterpillar Room

Our nursery: children from 2 years to 3 years

The room comprises a large play area, offering fun and enjoyable activities throughout the day, allowing free choice and interactive play during each session.





The Butterfly Room

This is our pre-school room, and the children are from 3 years to 4 years

The Butterfly Room has defined areas of development, linking in with the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Activities are provided to encourage independence ensuring that they are becoming more confident and school ready.







LEARNING THROUGH PLAY

We work towards the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum, seven areas of learning. Children are encouraged to participate in activities that are adapted for each child's individual need and developmental level.

The children have a variety of toys and resources available to them, that can be changed at the children's request. We aim to provide a fun and stimulating environment where children learn through play and share their culture, knowledge and experiences.

PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

Each child is an individual and is always responded to sensitively and carefully by Centre staff.

Children are encouraged to care for one another, for the equipment and their environment, they gradually learn to share and take turns. If a child hurts someone else, they will be taken aside, talked to quietly and then encouraged to rejoin their group.

MEALS AND REFRESHMENTS

Light snacks are provided by the Centre during the morning and afternoon sessions. These will be nutritious and consider all children's particular dietary requirements.

- » All other meals should be provided by the parents and must be stored in a suitable container with a thermos pack clearly labelled with the child's name.
- » We encourage all parents to provide a healthy lunch with no fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate bars.
- » Children under 18 months can have homemade meals provided they contain no meat, fish, rice or egg products.

- » We can give your child a commercial baby food jar or packet containing clearly labelled instructions and ingredients.
- » Please discuss your child's individual requirements when you register.
- » The Centre is a Nut-Free Zone.
